Unilateral Removal to an Interim Alternative Educational Setting by School Personnel and the Reason for Removal

1A (Y/N) B, C and D – Number of Removals (Drugs/Weapons/Serious Bodily Injury)

- Unilateral removal by school personnel Instances in which school personnel (not the IEP team) order the removal of children with disabilities (IDEA) from their current educational placement to an appropriate interim alternative educational setting for not more than 45 school days. Unilateral removals do not include decisions by the IEP team to change a student's placement.
- Exclude students who were moved from their current educational placement as a result of a decision by the IEP team to change a student's placement. For example, if following a discipline offense, the IEP team meets and determines that the child's current placement is not the least restrictive environment for that child, and therefore makes a permanent change in the child's IEP placement, do **not** report the as a Unilateral Removal.
- Not to be Reported only as R1 in Safe Schools
- Report as S8



2A (Y/N) - Removals to an Interim Alternative Educational Setting Based on a Hearing Officer Determination Regarding Likely Injury

Removal based on a hearing officer's determination – Instances in which an impartial hearing officer orders the removal of children with disabilities (IDEA) from their current educational placement to an appropriate alternative educational setting for not more than 45 school days based on the hearing officer's determination that maintaining the child's current placement is substantially likely to result in injury to the child or others

Report only Hearing Officers employed by Office for Dispute Resolution (ODR).



Out-of-School Suspensions/Expulsions – 3A and 3B In-School Suspensions 4C and 4D

3A/4C - Cumulative Days Totaling 10 Days or Less 3B/4D - Cumulative Days Totaling Greater than 10 Days

Students who were removed by school personnel for drugs, weapons, or serious bodily injury and were not sent to an interim alternative educational setting should be reported as having been suspended.

Include students who are suspended pending an IEP team meeting in which the students' IEP placements are changed.

In instances in which the IEP team meets to determine the appropriate setting where the student will receive educational services following an expulsion, outof-school suspension or in-school suspension, the removal must be included in this file.

5A – Total Number of REMOVALS

5B (1 day), 5C (2-10 days) and 5D (GT 10 days) – Total Number of DAYS (Y/N)

### How are counts reported by removal length?

The removal length is the cumulative length of removals during the school year.

- A child with less than 0.5 cumulative days should **not** be reported.
- A child with greater than or equal to 0.5 and less than 1.5 cumulative days should be counted in 5B
- A child with greater than or equal to 1.5 and less than or equal to 10.0 cumulative days should be counted in 5C
- A child with greater than 10.0 cumulative days should be counted in 5D



### Primary Placement Type (Y/N)

Field in Safe Schools and Table 9A

A student placed in a residential facility or group home by a non-educational agency (e.g., court systems; departments of corrections; departments of children, youth, and families; department of social services; etc.)

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### Comparing Table 9A to Safe School Data Common Issues

- "Reportable" vs "Non-Reportable offenses" being reported in SS
- (Report ALL incidents, including codes A and C)
- Vendors not pulling data correctly for SS uploads
- Students not marked as Student with IEP on Incident Offender Template
- Communication between special education office and the building principals
- Not enough information to report "out-placed" students disciplined by Non-PIMS reporting agencies
- Discipline for non-resident students not reported by LEA imposing discipline



### Comparing Table 9A to Safe School Data More Common Issues

Students receive initial OSS for 5-10 days then expulsion after hearing (For both SS and 9A report the most severe discipline only)

LEAs only reporting incidents on 9A in which student was not receiving services

(ALL incidents (Removals, ISS, OSS, Expulsions should be reported regardless of whether services were being received)

Difference between R1 (Alternative Education) and Column 1 on Table 9A



### Who Reports in Safe Schools?

SD/CS/IU/CTC submit to Safe Schools

An incident is to be reported by the entity that imposes the discipline. For example, if a reportable incident occurs in the confines of a class offered by an IU, the IU should report the incident if the IU disciplines the student. If the student is referred to the district of residence or charter school (sending LEA) for discipline, the district of residence or charter should report the incident.

### Who Reports in Safe Schools?

### SD/CS/IU/CTC submit to Safe Schools

LEAs reporting the discipline for students from other LEAs

You MUST contact the sending LEA and inform them their special education student has been disciplined and you have reported the incident in Safe Schools



### Who Reports in Safe Schools?

### Special education students disciplined by NON-PIMS reporting entities

Sending LEA must report the incident in Safe Schools.

# Safe Schools Reporting

**ALL** discipline incidents resulting in disciplinary action codes S3 - S9 must be submitted in the discipline domain PIMS submission. (Not just in aggregate)

**NOTE:** All incidents involving infractions coded 1-54 are to be reported, regardless of the level of discipline administered. Academic/Student and Code of Conduct infractions (Infraction Codes A and C) are to be reported if they result in disciplinary action codes S3 through S9.
